DEBATE: LABOURING IN THE SHADOWS, 21 OCT DE BALIE A'DAM

BASIC RIGHTS

<u>Court of Appeal: status holder retains the right to stay in AZC shelter in spite of not having registered</u> three times

Asylum seekers are obliged to register weekly at the AZC where they live. This Syrian refugee had been granted a status but had no living accommodation yet. He had failed to register three times at the AZC, for which reason the COA wanted to evict him from the shelter and to discontinue his financial benefit. However, the Court is of the opinion that it cannot come to that. The Haqbin ruling obliges The Netherlands to offer asylum seekers shelter. The measure by the COA must be reversed. <u>Court of Appeal: de-registration GBA [Municipal Personal Records Database] insufficient for ruling residence outside of The Netherlands</u>

When holders of a residence permit stay outside of The Netherlands for a long time, their right of residence can be discontinued as a result. In this case the alien had not been registered in the GBA for a long time, for which reason his permit was revoked.

The Court is of the opinion that the de-registration from the GBA in itself is not enough reason to conclude that someone has left The Netherlands. Other information has to be taken into consideration as well, in this case letters from the priest and the imam from Venlo. Moreover, the alien himself has to be given the opportunity to tell his story. The IND has to reconsider its decision. You will find more information here.

Court of Appeal: issuing facilitating visa for Moroccan mother with Dutch child in Morocco

A facilitating visa is an entry visa for foreigners who have right of residence in The Netherland

A facilitating visa is an entry visa for foreigners who have right of residence in The Netherlands on the basis of EU legislation. This Moroccan mother still lives in Morocco with her Dutch child, but wants to live in The Netherlands. The Court is of the opinion that The Netherlands should issue a facilitating visa so that the IND in The Netherlands can investigate whether they have right of residence on the basis of the Chavez ruling. CHECK AND DETENTION

ACVZ: because of corona 38% fewer people in detention

The ACVZ [Adviescommissie VreemdelingenZaken – Advisory Committee Immigration] produced a survey of the lessons that can be learnt from the Covid-19 pandemic with respect to migration. One of the conclusions is that working from home will diminish the necessity for knowledge migrants. The pandemic has also affected travel opportunities. Fewer asylum seekers and foreign students have arrived. Many eviction flights had to be cancelled as well and many people had to be released from the immigration detention centres. The number of voluntary returnees remained the same. You will find more information here.

<u>Kick-off meeting project SELF-DETERMINATION and RIGHT OF RESIDENCE 29 November 14:30-17:30</u> In October 2019 the network UN Women's Treaty together with the Platform Self-Determination and Right of Residence organised a <u>meeting</u> 'Women, Right of Residence and International Treaties' and published <u>a survey</u> about the question whether the five-year-dependent residence permit is consistent with international treaties such as the UN Women's Treaty and the Istanbul Treaty.

Subsequent to this the Platform has launched the project 'Self-Determination and Right of Residence' about the consequences of the dependent right of residence for the emancipation, integration and safety of women.
